- We also added **new Cancer to 5K teams in Chicago and New York**, expanding our reach geographically and allowing more survivors to take back their lives from cancer by crossing the finish line of a 5K.


Making A Difference

As part of UCF's 4K training weekend, all of the 4K riders and runners were encouraged to join the bone marrow registry by getting swabbed. Chris did, and just over a year later, got a call from Delete Blood Cancer that he had been matched with a 16 year old with a rare blood cancer who lives in the United States. Chris underwent 5 days of shots, doctor visits, and a 7-hour procedure, but it was all worth it when he learned that the marrow was successfully grafted and is now producing its own cells. Thanks to UCF's partnership with There Goes My Hero, and the 4K for Cancer's commitment to serving others, Chris had the opportunity to help save the life of a young adult fighting cancer.






